CONDITIONS OF PLAY:

1. Laws and Regulations: Played under the Laws of the Sport of Bowls and Bowls New Zealand Associated Regulations as applicable.

2. Controlling Body: The Controlling Body for this event is the Bowls North Harbour Match Committee. The Controlling Body will have the right to alter, add to or delete any conditions of play and/or special conditions to enable the completion of the tournament.

3. Entry Requirements: In this event all players in each team must be full playing members of the same club affiliated to Bowls North Harbour.

4. Code of Conduct: All players will comply with and observe the requirements of the "Code of Conduct for players at Bowls North Harbour Event" as set down in the Bowls North Harbour Centre Handbook.

5. Postponements: Any postponements due to weather conditions will be on the Bowls North Harbour website & face-book page.

6. Clothing: Players in a team will wear their club uniforms, whites or matching team clothing. This means the same coloured pants/skirt and shirts. Logos that conflict with the event sponsor will not be permitted.

7. Mobile phone: Use is not permitted by players on or alongside the greens during play. It is preferred that cell phones are switched off or turned to silent.

8. Smoking Policy – There shall be no smoking on the greens or immediate surrounds. Smoking areas will be designated at each venue as advised by the host club duty officer. Please be advised that some clubs in North Harbour are completely smoke-free clubs.

9. Alcohol Policy – Alcohol shall only be consumed in areas defined by the host club liquor licence and in no event be allowed on the green or surrounds during play.

10. Trial Ends: Before the scheduled start of play in any game, or before continuing an unfinished game on another day, one trial end may be played in each direction. Please refer to Laws of the Sport of Bowls, Law 5.1.

11. Late Appearances: When any player has failed to be in position to commence play 15 minutes after the scheduled starting time, the game will be awarded to the opponent.

12. Score cards: These must be completed clearly and in full for every game. The names of all players and the time the game finished must be entered, and the score card must be signed by both SKIPS/PLAYERS and then handed to the umpire.

13. Entry Fees and withdrawals: Entry fees will be refunded to entries not accepted. No refunds will be made to teams or players who withdraw less than 48 hours prior to the scheduled commencement of the event. Any withdrawals must



be notified to the Bowls North Harbour office by 12 noon on the day preceding the scheduled commencement of the event.

14. Appeal against decisions of Umpires: “The Umpire’s decision is final in all circumstances except those relating to the meaning or interpretation of a law, in which case there will be a right of appeal to the Controlling Body” (Law 43.2.6). Any such appeal must be lodged with the umpire/event Director within 10 minutes of the conclusion of the game and will be referred to the controlling body.

15. Replacements / Substitutes: Any change in playing personnel shall be subject to the prior approval of the Controlling Body. Applications will be considered for the following reasons; sickness, bereavement, work commitments, Jury service, Bowls NZ commitments. Other individual exceptional circumstances may also be considered. The Controlling Body may require documents or evidence to support any applications. An application form is available in the Bowls North Harbour Centre Handbook, or in the Club Secretary’s Manual.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF PLAY:

Womens Centre Triples

1. Play will commence by: 8:30am on Saturday and Sunday.

2. Bowls: Each player will play 2 bowls in each end.

3. Qualifying: Entries will be drawn into sections of 4, a round robin of 3 games of 18 ends or 2¼ hours. All games in qualifying **MUST** be completed **IN FULL** if the result has any bearing on the potential qualification of any team within the section.

4. Defaults: If a team defaults their score will be recorded as a loss. The non-offending team will be awarded a win and the average net total of shots scored by the winning teams in the same round of the same section.

5. Time limit: A time limit of 2 ¼ hours will be applied in qualifying play. If the jack has been delivered before the time signal the end will continue and if it subsequently becomes dead it will be replayed.

6. Ties in qualifying play: If a game is a tied at the completion of 18 ends, or at the time limit, then both teams will be awarded 1 point.

7. Determining a section winner: Three points will be awarded for each game won. 1 point will be awarded to each team if a game is tied. Where game points are equal the winner of each section will be the team with the highest net total of shots. If the game points and the net total of shots are equal the team with the lowest “total shots against” will be the winner. If these are equal, the team that won the game when the two teams met will be the section winner.

8. Restricting the Movement of Players During Play: In all games, players will only be allowed to walk up to the head under the following circumstances:

Leads: after delivery of their second bowl.

Twos: after delivery of their second bowl.

Skips: after delivery of their first bowl.

9. Post Section:

All Section winners will progress to post-section on Sunday 24th February at Milford Bowling Club. Winners of Sections 3 – 6 will start post section play at 8.30am and winners of sections 1 and 2 will commence after 10.00 am. Post

Section will be sudden death, 18 ends. There is to be no time limit in post-section play. Each player will play 2 bowls in each end.

10. Prize Money: Prize Money will be paid at the completion of this tournament.

11. Inclement Weather: During qualifying play, if weather conditions affect play a minimum of eight [8] ends will constitute a game. If weather forces abandonment of play, 2 completed games will constitute completion of section play, and a result found from the 2 completed games. Each venue will be considered a separate competition when applying this rule. If weather forces abandonment at any one venue before the completion of at least 2 games of qualifying, the balance of events will be transferred to Day Two. If Day Two play is affected by weather conditions, the balance of games will be transferred to the next available reserve day.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF PLAY: MEN'S Centre SINGLES

1. Play will commence by: 8:30am on Saturday and Sunday.

2. Bowls: Each player will play 4 bowls in each end.

3. Qualifying: Entries will be drawn into sections of 4, a round robin of 3 games of 21 shots, NO TIME LIMIT. All games in qualifying MUST be completed IN FULL if the result has any bearing on the potential qualification of any team within the section.

4. Marking: All players are required to mark one round of play. This is indicated on the chart by an **M**. ANY PLAYER WHO FAILS TO MARK THEIR SCHEDULED GAME WHEN REQUIRED WILL BE IMMEDIATELY DISQUALIFIED FROM THE COMPETITION.

5. Defaults: If a player defaults their score will be recorded as a loss. The non-offending team will be awarded a win and the average net total of shots scored by the winning teams in the same round of the same section.

7. Determining a section winner: Three points will be awarded for each game won. Where game points are equal the winner of each section will be the team with the highest net total of shots. If the game points and the net total of shots are equal the team with the "highest shots for" will be the winner. If these are equal, the team that won the game when the two teams met will be the section winner.

8. Restricting the Movement of Players During Play: In all games, players will only be allowed to walk up to the head after delivery of their third bowl.

9. Post Section:

The winners of each section will go through to Post Section play. Byes: Section winners of sections 1 to 13 have byes to the last 16. Winners of sections 14 to 19 will play their first post section game at 8.30am on Sunday 24th February. Last 16 play will commence at the conclusion of these play off games. Winners of sections 1 to 13 to report to Milford Bowling Club at 10.00am. Post Section will be sudden death, first to 21 shots. Players defeated in post section must be prepared to mark in the next round if required.

The final will not be completed on Sunday and will be played at a date to be confirmed by the Bowls North Harbour Board in consultation with the players.

10. Prize Money: Prize Money will be paid at the completion of this tournament.

11. Inclement Weather: During qualifying play, if weather conditions affect play a minimum of twelve[12] ends will constitute a game. If weather forces

abandonment of play, 2 completed games will constitute completion of section play, and a result found from the 2 completed games. Each venue will be considered a separate competition when applying this rule. If weather forces abandonment at any one venue before the completion of at least 2 games of qualifying, the balance of events will be transferred to Day Two. If Day Two play is affected by weather conditions, the balance of games will be transferred to the next available reserve day.

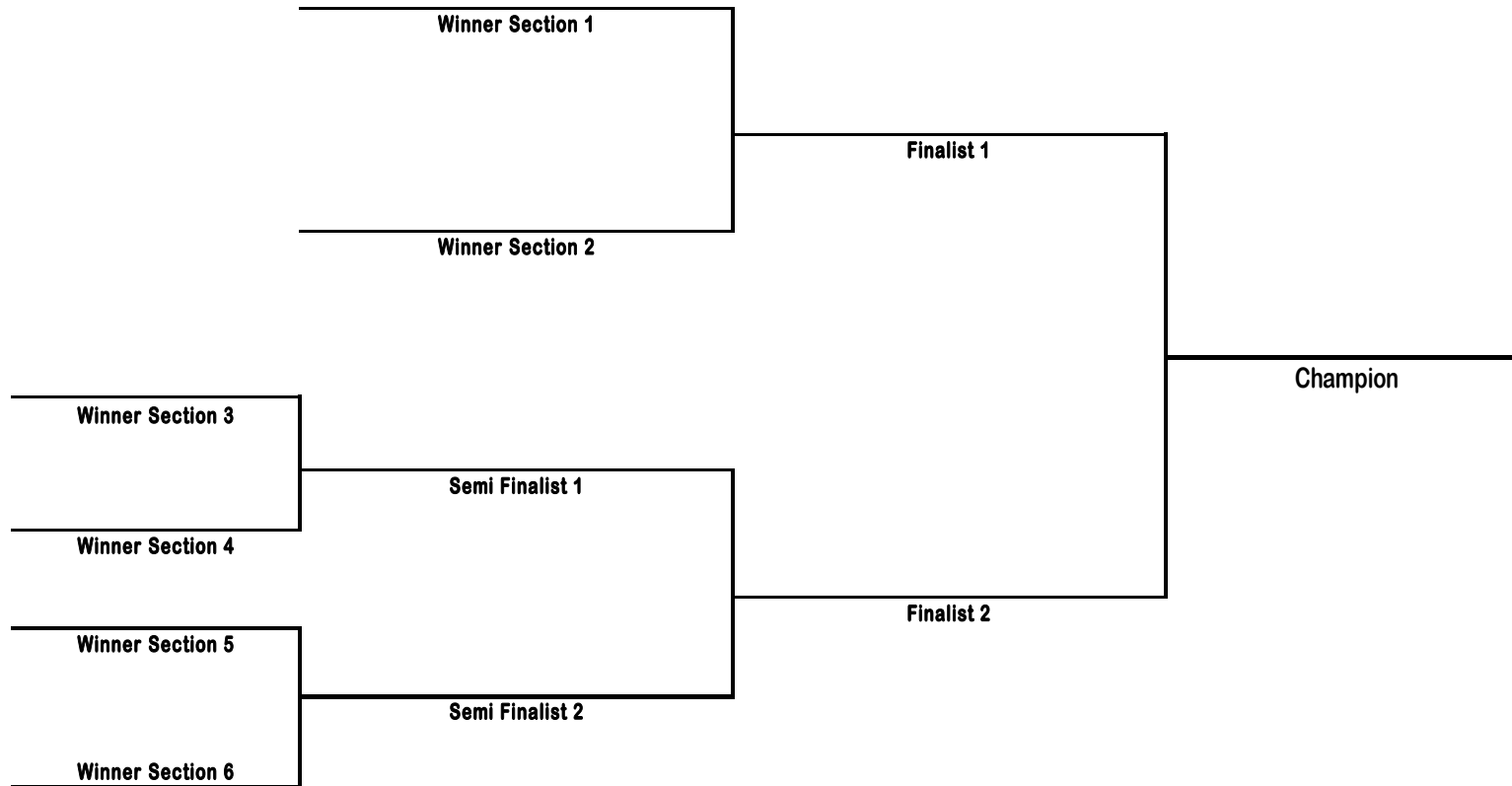
Bowls North Harbour Centre Triples Women's Post Section
