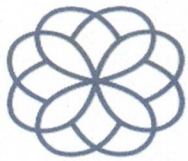

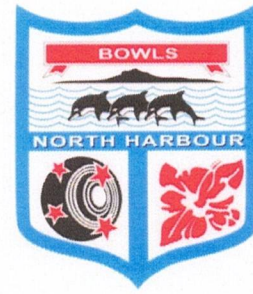

Competition Structure:	4 Sections - 6,4,4,4 – 18 Entries	
Team Composition	7 Players plus 1 optional reserve. Players must be with 1 – 5 years of experience	
Game Structure:	Singles to 21 shots Pairs - 3 bowls per player - 15 ends Triples – 2 bowls per player – 15 ends	Time limit 2 Hours

Qualification:	The top 2 teams from each section – 8 teams

The Grove Orewa 1-5 year Interclub

- 1. General Conditions:** The "General Conditions of Play" as they are available on the Bowls North Harbour website will apply to this event to the extent they are applicable.
- 2. Club Membership:** All players in a side must be from the same Club. In exceptional circumstances and on request, the Centre may allow a composite side to enter if a club or clubs have insufficient members to form a side. The players in a composite team may wear their own club colours.
- 3. Order of Play:** Players may not interchange between the singles, pairs and triples disciplines during a game, but the teams within the side may be changed before a game, including the named reserve, if required. A player cannot be swapped between sides if more than one side represents a club.
- 4. Jack Delivery:** If the jack has been delivered before the end of the signalled time, the end will continue and if the end subsequently becomes dead it will be replayed.
- 5. Dead Ends:** If an end becomes dead it must be replayed.
- 6. Restricting the movement of players during play:** In all games, players will only be allowed to walk up to the head under the following circumstances:

Singles: After the delivery of their third and fourth bowl.

Pairs:

Leads: After the delivery of their third bowl.

Skips: After the delivery of their second bowl.

Triples:

Leads & Seconds: After delivery of their second bowl.

Skips: After delivery of each of their bowls.

In exceptional and limited circumstances, a singles player can ask the marker for permission to walk up to the head earlier than described above or a skip can ask a player to walk up to the head earlier than described above. If a player does not meet the terms of this law, Law 35 will apply.

- 7. Qualifying:** Sides will be drawn into one section of six (6) sides and three sections of four (4) sides, playing a scrambled draw on day one, with the top two (2) sides from each section going forward to post section on day two.
- 8. Ties in qualifying play:** If a game is tied at the completion of the number of ends, or after the end is completed when the time limit is signalled, or at the completion of the minimum number of ends as stated in the conditions of play "Inclement Weather" below, then both teams will be awarded one point.
- 9. Defaults:** If a team or singles player defaults their score will be recorded as a loss. The non-offending team or singles player will be awarded a win and the average net total of shots scored by the winning teams or singles players in the same round of the same section of the same discipline.
- 10. Determining a Section Winner:** The finishing position of each side shall be determined as follows:
 - a)** Highest match points (a match meaning the three games of each discipline played between the two sides) where two points will be awarded for each match won and one point for each match drawn;
 - b)** Where match points are equal the side with the highest game points (with one game point being awarded for each game won within a match and half a game point awarded for each game tied) shall be the superior side;
 - c)** If match points and game points are tied at the end of the qualifying rounds, the side which has the highest total of net shots (shots gained less shots conceded equals total net shots) shall be the superior side;
 - d)** If at the end of the qualifying rounds, match points, game points and total net shots are unable to separate two or more sides, the side with the highest total of shots gained across all games in all matches shall be the superior side.

- 11. Post Section:** The two (2) winning sides from each section will qualify to Post Section play. Post Section play will be to find a club winning side over the three disciplines of each game played.
- 12. Inclement Weather:** During qualifying play, if weather conditions affect play a minimum of eleven [11] ends in singles, a minimum eight [8] ends in pairs, and a minimum eight [8] ends in triples will constitute a match. If weather forces abandonment of play, two completed matches will constitute completion of section play, and a result found from the two completed matches. If Day Two play is affected by weather conditions, the balance of the matches will be transferred to the next available reserve day.
- 13. Advice:** It is permissible for any Accredited Coach or Manager to advise a Player(s) in their side during the course of this competition as permitted in accordance with Law 44 of the Laws of the Sport.
- 14. Side Manager:** It is essential that each side have a manager appointed for each game. This manager may be a player in the side. The duties of a Side Manager are:
 - a. To list the correct names of the members of their side on the team sheet prior to the start of play for each tournament day.
 - b. To ensure a toss is completed at the beginning of each round for all disciplines (Law 5.2).
 - c. To ensure that score cards are completed in full for each round.
- 15. Markers:** Each team must provide a marker, which can be the 7th player. Failure for any side not having a marker available will likely bring a penalty on the club.
- 16. Winning Side:** The club side winning this event will be eligible to take up the Bowls North Harbour allocation for entry into the Mercedes Cup event to be played in Northland and expected to be in May 2025.
